As an ordained Elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Zion (AMEZ) Church, Tami serves as the Director of Mission Education, the Interfaith Strategy Coalition Liaison for the Hendersonville District and as the proud Pastor of Pharr Chapel AMEZ Church in Old Fort, N.C.



Tami is a popular educator, community organizer, cultural organizer, and the Lead Organizer for Faith 4 Justice Asheville, an ecumenical and multi-faith group of clergy and faith leaders committed to “provoking justice for black and brown bodied people” through discernment, advocacy, capacity building and providing a ministry of presence with impacted communities.” She is the Equity Missioner for a collaborative ministry partnership between the Cathedral of All Souls Episcopal Church and Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church in Asheville, N.C. And she facilitates racial reconciliation processes across North Carolina through her consulting practice, Inside & Out Consulting. Tami fosters healing from oppression, white supremacy and anti-blackness with an intersectional and faith lens. She believes “If I am unwilling to support the liberation of all humanity, then I will never be free myself.” Tami earned a Certificate of Nonprofit Management from Duke University. She graduated *magna cum laude*, from Ashford University with a Bachelor of Arts in Education and Public Policy, and *summa cum laude* from Hood Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity.
