Stewardship Corner

Tithing v. Pledging

There are many terms used to describe giving money to a church. Two of the most common, "tithing" and "pledging", are related but different. Pledging means stating early in the fiscal planning cycle what you intend to give of your time, talent and money to church during the coming year. It isn't a binding promise but is your best estimate of what you will contribute to the ministries of the church.

Tithing, on the other hand, means different things depending on who you ask. While we often think of it as giving 10% of one's income, the term originally referred to farmers giving a portion of their livestock or crops to help feed the needy. For some church members today, that's translated into committing to give a certain percentage of personal resources to the church.

No matter how you frame consideration of your giving plan for 2019, we appreciate your discernment of how God is leading you to support and to further the work of GCPC in the coming year. Members of the Stewardship Committee are available for any questions you may have should that be helpful to you.



Haywood Street Congregation Clothing Bin

The SERVE Council is delighted to announce that the Haywood Street Congregation Clothing Bin is in place and ready to accept donations. We want to express a huge thank you to all the church members who have volunteered to transport the donations to the Haywood Street Congregation facility.

Here are a few guidelines to keep in mind as you share your used items with the folks at Haywood Street:

• Please limit your donations to seasonal clothing. Haywood Street does not have the storage capacity to store out of season clothing.

- It is important to bag donations before placing them into the bin. Using trash bags no larger than kitchen size trash bags will make it easier to fit your donation into the bin and easier for the volunteers to retrieve and transport to Haywood.
- Men's clothing is the #1 need. All men's clothing will be utilized. Men's pants in size 30-34 are especially needed. Underwear, socks and t-shirts are always needed.
- Women's clothing is needed. Children's clothing is accepted but is not a priority.
- T-shirts of all sizes are needed. T-shirts work for both men and women.
- Shoes are needed, especially work boots and tennis shoes.
- Toiletries needed are toilet paper, women's feminine products, shampoo, deodorant. Hotel sized samples are welcome.
