Sung Refrain: Creator, kindle our deep connection (2x)

One: Creator, thank you for this beautiful planet and for the awe inspiring universe. Thank you for how the earth teaches us about balance and right relationship. Kindle our resolve to acknowledge our complicated history on this land called "Togiyasdi," by the Fire People, the Cherokee ancestors. And cultivate within us deep, embodied awareness of the sacredness in these ancient mountains and in the mystery and majesty of all the wildlife and trees and plants that thrive here. Help us to honor and make space for the ways bears, wild turkeys and elk find ways to thrive even as habitats gentrify.

Sung Refrain: Redeemer, encourage our transformation (2x)

One: Redeemer, thank you for the ways you have met the human family where we are, and for the ways you understand and extend compassion. Thank you for calling us to our best possibilities. Encourage us to deepen our understanding of the harmful history of Christianity, and the ways Christians have stolen land from non-Christians all over the world. Encourage our capacity to remember that the harm done by the Doctrine of Discovery and Christianity authorizing genocide are all part of our legacy on this land. Give us clarity and resolve to repair the harmful history of Presbyterian participation in chattel slavery, boarding schools for indigenous children, and upholding white supremacy in the ways faith has been lived out.

Sung Refrain: Sustainer, nourish our healing journey (2x)

One: Sustainer, thank you for the way your Spirit moves and breathes in our community. Thank you for your mysterious power and presence in and through this gathered body when we come to this table. Thank you for signs of resilience and resolve in the way this land now grows food and community. Support our awareness that the paths now paved for commerce and commutes around 789 Merrimon Avenue, were a thoroughfare of trade and travel for indigenous people. Instill us with clear memory that white colonizers named these roads after wealthy landowners and lawmakers dedicated to supporting chattel slavery. And that redlining cleared a way for Presbyterians to plant this church in a white enclave. Help us practice following you on unknown paths, letting go and leaning in. Strengthen our belief that we can change and that the world can change, too.
